Without working kidneys, your body cannot function Some Facts about Kidney Failure

Once a Patient is diagnosed with Kidney Failure, they will ALWAYS require some form of treatment which if diagnosed early enough, normally starts with drug therapy.

Later stages of kidney failure require dialysis and ultimately a kidney transplant

Dialysis and Transplantation are treatments, not cures.

Dialysis as a Hospital Outpatient or at a Dialysis Unit usually requires 3 visits per week. Each session lasts for up to 4 hours. The Patient is given a time slot which is usually Morning or Afternoon. Some Units also offer a 'Twilight' slot which suits those still in work.

Some Patients have to endure either more or less dialysis depending on their condition.

There are various forms of Home Dialysis. Peritoneal Dialysis can be adapted to personal needs and involves a tube in the stomach and exchanges of fluid which then carries the toxins from the body. This can involve regular 'bag' exchanges approximately 4 times per day or the use of a machine which can perform this task automatically overnight.

Haemodialysis (which is usually performed at hospital as it involves direct access to the bloodstream using needles) is now being offered to suitable patients to manage at home. This requires training and support from family members.

What We Do

Established in October 1979, we provide assistance to ALL Patients with Kidney Failure no Committee with experience of all forms of Kidney matter what age within the 01704 telephone code area or who dialyse at the Southport NHS Dialysis Unit.

The Committee of volunteers works to raise funds to support our Kidney Patients and other Kidney Charities dedicated to research in this field.

Southport Kidney Fund (SKF) can provide Financial Assistance to patients who request it. Each request is taken on its own merits and the Committee meets monthly to discuss who needs help.

Previously we have helped pay dialysis costs for holidays, helped patients after flooding of their home, paid towards computer courses. All requests for help are considered fairly.

Each year we have a variety of fund raising events including a Christmas Fair and various Supermarket Collections. We ALWAYS need extra help with these activities.
