Our Vision and mission is to tackle the segregation of visually impaired children in the developing world, by providing the essentials in assisted technologies to give them the best start supporting a Sightpack, you will give a in life. The Sightbox content helps develop key skills for an independent lifestyle in countries without the supportive infrastructure such as our own.

Blind children are some of the most segregated and disengaged individuals in their society, and with your help Sightbox will change this. By supporting a Sightbox you will give a developing school all the essentials for group sporting activities necessary for skill development and communication. Where has Sightbox been?





The Sightbox project has successfully delivered Sightboxes to developing schools in Nepal, Pakistan and Sierra Leone thanks to the help of local Rotary clubs and schools. The impact of the Sightbox initiative has been massive, these children have been declined the simple right to be able to engage in sporting activities as the necessary equipment is simply not available. By encouraging group sporting activities, these children will develop essential communication and navigational skills desperately needed to live an independent life.

More than 90% of the worlds visually impaired individuals live in developing countries were research shows that social isolation is at its highest. With 85% unempolyment within the visually impaired community around the world the prospects of employment are low, and even lower in the developing world.
